3 – Short summary (150 words)

Brief description of the research project.

4 – Detailed description of the research project (1000 words)

Free section where you should describe your research project, methodology, etc. Please ensure that this section fits within the overall 3,000 word limit for the synopsis.

5 – Concise table of contents (up to 15 lines)

Include the main structure of the full project or of the section that you will present at the meeting.

6 – Results achieved so far (max. 500 words)

Brief discussion of the results already achieved, by you, in your research. This section does not apply if you feel you are still in the early stages or the results are unitary and cannot be detailed in this way.

7 – Expected results (max. 500 words)

Brief description of what you expect to show/prove with your thesis (i.e. your contribution to the tax scientific community). This section should not overlap with point –

1 (the Aim): it should address the specific conclusions that you want to achieve with your research.

8 – Bibliographic references (max. 10 references)

Landmark works that constitute the state of the art in your field of research and give a solid basis to the ideas you are going to explore in your thesis.

9 – Planned outputs and time frame (max. 10 references)

List the planned outputs (book, book chapters, articles, conferences and other events) that you have in mind. Also mention also the interplay between these outputs in terms of how the results of your research will be disseminated to the scientific community.
